NHASP trained mentor-coaches focus on:

- Increasing effective communication with all constituents
- Shaping school culture and strengthening organizational effectiveness
- Developing conflict resolution strategies and proactive solutions to problems
- Avoiding unnecessary trouble
- Heightened self-reflection and self-regulation
- Increasing student achievement and sense of well-being
